IV. Items under Chief Procurement Officer

A. Action Items: Contracts and Procurement Items (Attachment #1)

Dr. Kiran Joshi and Dr. Rachel Rubin, Senior Medical Officers and Co-Leads, Cook County Department of Public Health (CCDPH), provided an overview of the CCDPH grant-funded contractual requests (#1-5).

IV. Items under Chief Procurement Officer

A. Action Items: Contracts and Procurement Items (continued)

Aaron Galeener, Interim Chief Executive Officer, Health Plan Services, reviewed the CountyCare-related items (#6-7). Charles Jones, Chief Procurement Officer, provided an overview of the remaining contractual requests presented for the Committee's consideration. The Committee reviewed and discussed the requests.

Chair Reiter commented on the subject of sole source contracts in general. He noted that there are a number of those presented today for consideration. They typically come in a variety of ways - contracts expire and the Request for Proposals (RFPs) are not done in time, or there are some companies that have proprietary products and there are no other available sources. Over a number of years we've had the conversations about whether there is a better way to deal with timeline issues, and also the exploration of other options when we're in a situation dealing with proprietary products from the incumbent vendor. Many of you may recall that this Board recently approved a contract with Deloitte to help us do a full review of our procurement process and consider ways to cut down on our sole source contracts as a whole, or at least create a better process to handle that. Israel Rocha, Jr., Chief Executive Officer, confirmed that the administration is in the process of onboarding Deloitte to help restructure the procurement department and streamline the process.

Director Harrington requested that at some point the Directors receive some sort of reporting on Deloitte's progress. Chair Reiter stated that there is a plan to have a briefing on the process and progress anticipated.

Iliana Mora, Chief Operating Officer of Ambulatory Services, provided an overview of request number 11 (extend and increase contract with MHNU Corporation, d/b/a Medical Home Network). Director Deer noted that he has issues with extending the contract and not putting it out for RFP, which is what has been done to date with this contract. Chair Reiter responded that the purpose of this extension is to allow for time to go through the RFP process for this service. Extending this contract to January 31, 2023 should allow for enough time to go through the RFP process without the need for any additional extensions.

Caryn Stancik, Chief Communications and Marketing Officer, provided an overview of request number 17 (execute contract with Res Publica Group, LLC). She responded to questions regarding M/WBE participation. She stated that the team brought this contract forward with full compliance on the goals, as well as certified M/WBE; it is set at the full goal of 35%. Director Deer inquired regarding funding for marketing efforts geared towards Covid-19 and M/WBE participation. Ms. Stancik responded that, on the Trust Us campaign, which was about \$4.2 million, almost 90% of that went to M/WBE. She added that she will send additional information on that subject to Director Deer.

In response to a question from Director Harrington regarding why the contract dollar amount is higher than the previous contract, Ms. Stancik stated that the increase in dollar amount relates to receiving considerably more marketing services. Director Harrington requested that a report be provided at the end of the first year with metrics. Chair Reiter was not sure if there would be a committee home for that report, but Ms. Stancik can provide an update either to the full Board, Finance Committee or Managed Care Committee.

Director Story commented regarding the scope of work relative to scoring metrics. He stated that he has a concern with approving a three (3) year contract without any definitive metrics at the front end that the Board has reviewed. He noted that the contract is for services provided relating to CCH and CountyCare; he inquired whether CCDPH is included in the contract. Ms. Stancik responded that, although CCDPH was included in the My Shot and Trust Us campaigns, they have historically operated their marketing efforts separate from CCH. Dr. Rubin provided additional information. CCDPH currently has an RFP out for a couple of marketing campaigns. They were not aware of the expansion of the marketing contract with CCH and CountyCare, and were not included in that RFP.

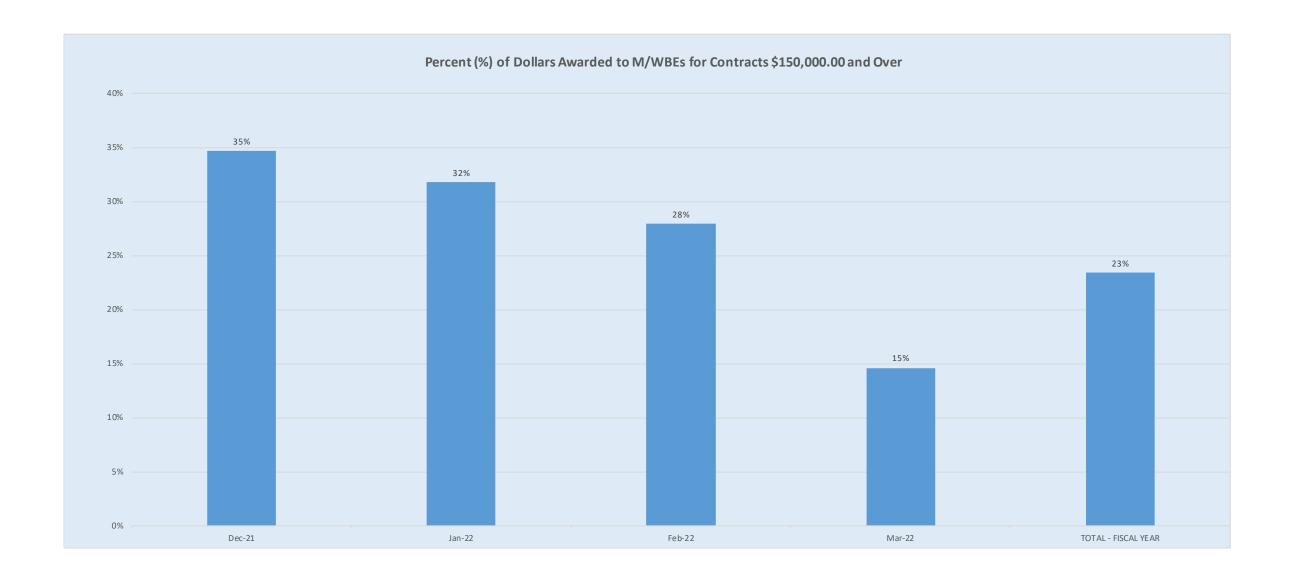

- On an accrual basis, interim financials show that CCH ended March with a \$1.2M positive variance to budget. On a cash basis, the County's preliminary cash report on revenues and expenses shows a \$242.5M positive variance primarily due to the timing difference of CountyCare PMPM payments impacting the revenue and claims payments impacting expenses.

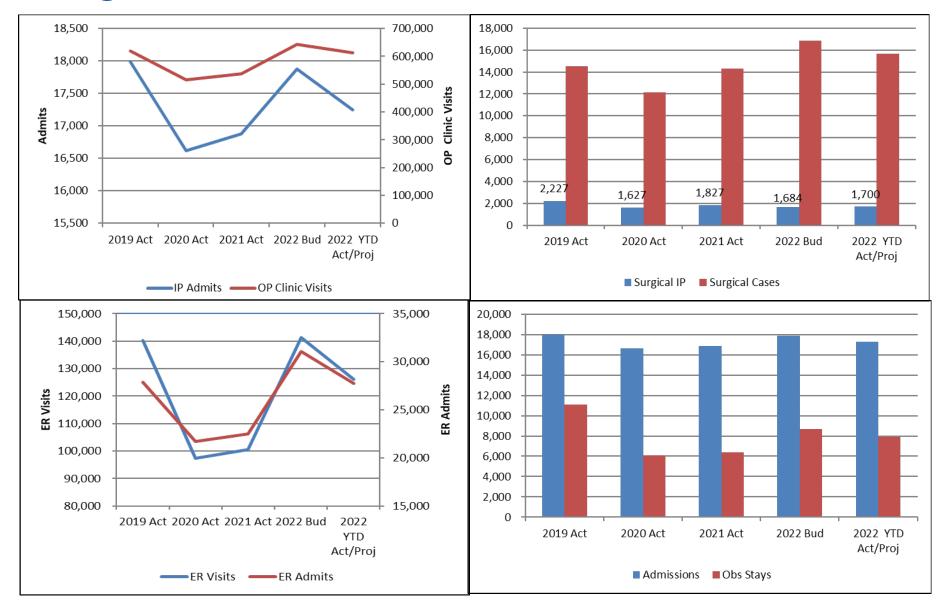

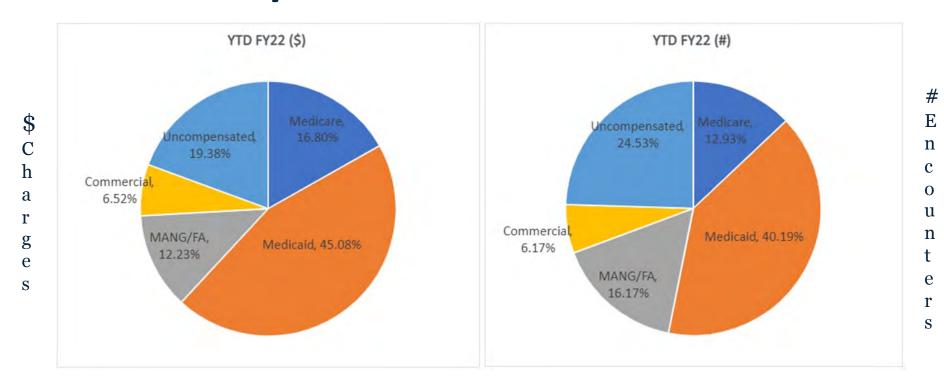

Payer Mix – YTD March 2022



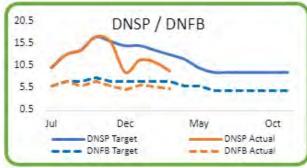

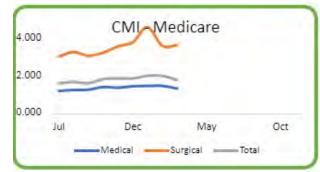
Revenue Cycle KPI Trending

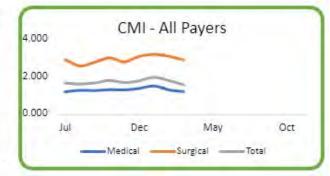










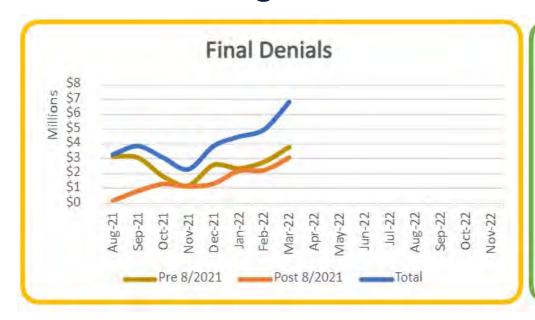

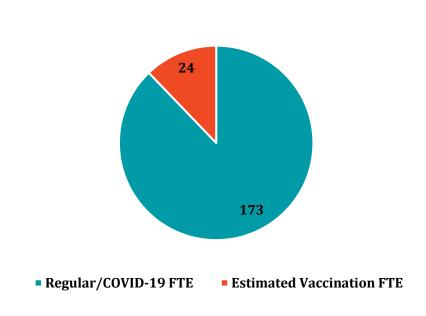

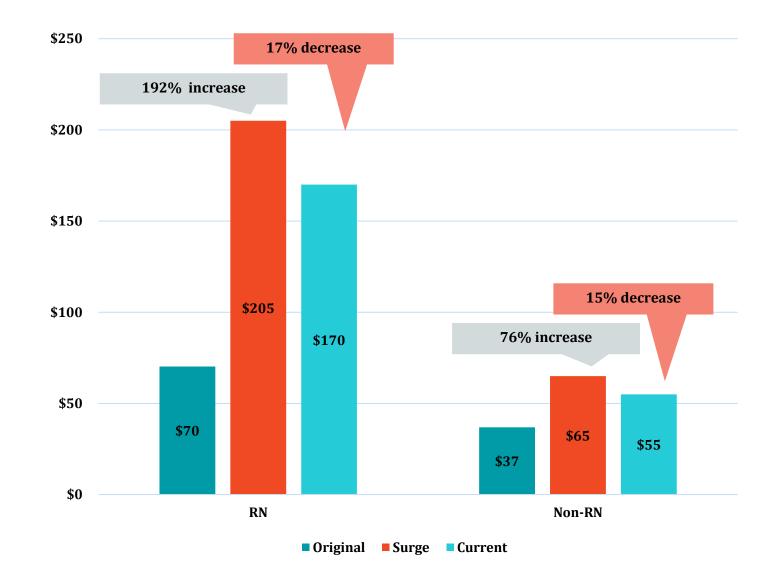

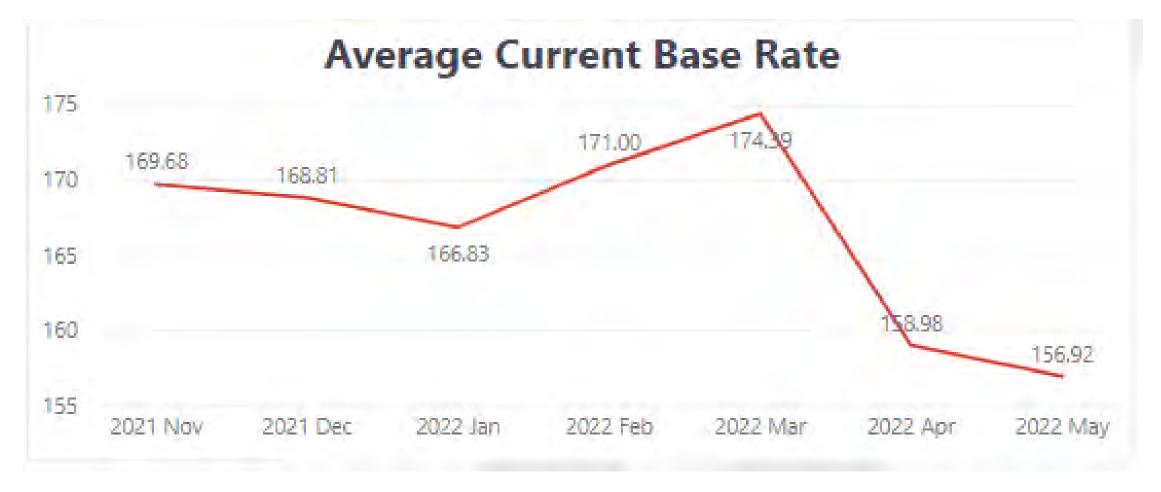
Vaya Rates Comparison
