# 1. Call To Order / Roll Call / Introductions.

Akia Vang called the meeting to order and asked Kelly Muellman to conduct Roll Call. A quorum of members were present. Akia asked everyone to introduce themselves and answer the ice breaker question "what are you looking forward to summer?"

# 2. Adopt February Agenda.

There was a motion to adopt the February agenda with one amendment: adding a discussion of Aldi leaving the Northside, between items 8 and 9. There was a second and all voted in favor.

# 3. Accept January Minutes.

There was a motion to accept the <u>Jan 11, 2023 Northside Green Zone Task Force</u> minutes. There was a second and all voted in favor.

#### 4. Stolen Land and Enslaved Peoples Acknowledgment

Georgianna Yantos read the Stolen Land and Enslaved Peoples Acknowledgment
As we begin, let's pause for a moment to contemplate an Indigenous Land and Enslaved
Peoples. We have to start with honesty. Land acknowledgement is a traditional custom
dating back centuries for many Native communities and nations. For non-Indigenous
communities, land acknowledgement is a powerful way of showing respect and
honoring the Indigenous Peoples of the land on which we work and live.

The Indigenous Land and Enslaved Peoples Acknowledgement:

"We invite you to recognize the written histories of United States specifically Midwestern States as fractured. Let us acknowledge then that we are currently on the land of the Indigenous who continue to be systematically erased by policies and

practices that remove their histories from this place. Let us honor the enslaved people who built the wealth and foundation of the United States. Let us recognize the histories of the United States as complicit with the racism of white supremacy. We recognize that these difficult histories persist in present-day racial realities and privileges within our environmental justice movement. We commit to dismantling racism in spaces of our work. We invite you to work beside us to create change.

# 5. City Tree program

Sydney Schaaf and Alejandra Rodriguez Diaz share about the three tree programs offered by the Minneapolis Health Department.

- 1. **Spring Tree Lottery:** Minneapolis residents can enter our lottery to buy a low-cost, \$30 tree ( $\sim$ \$150 value). The lottery is open from Feb. 1 March 31. **Enter the lottery**.
- 2. Free trees for Green Zone residents: Green Zone residents can sign up for a free tree while supplies last. The Health Department and Tree Trust will deliver the tree and plant it for the resident.

3. **Trees for businesses:** businesses in Minneapolis can apply for tree(s) anytime during the year. The City partners with Tree Trust to plant trees in the spring and fall. Trees cost \$30 each and includes a free consultation with a landscaper, delivery and planting.

# 6. Minneapolis Shared Mobility and Mobility Hubs

The City's lead mobility planner, Russ Brooks presented on mobility initiatives in Minneapolis, including bike-share, scooter-share, EV car-share, and the expansion of mobility hubs (where all options are within a block of each other with signage / wayfinding, branding, seating and paid Ambassadors). Russ also shared that they are doing an on-road air monitoring project starting this summer. They will attach a custom-made set of air sensors onto an electric bike and hire someone to ride it around the City for 5 hours per day / 365 days straight. This data will be combined with the data the Health Department is collecting from stationary air sensors to create a really good picture of air quality in Minneapolis (and hopefully measure progress as the City implements air pollution mitigation projects over time).

#### 7. 2023 Northside Green Zone leadership elections

Kelly made a call for nominations for Northside Green Zone leadership team (4 members). There were five candidates: Georgianna Yantos self-nominated, Andrew Larson self-nominated (by email, in absentia), Audua Pugh self-nominated, Hillary Thomas accepted the nomination by LesLee Jackson, and Jayda Pounds accepted the nomination by Roxxanne O'Brien. Members were given ballot slips and could vote for their four choices. The results of the election were: Georgianna, Audua, Hillary and Jayda.

## 8. Minneapolis Zoning update

Roxxanne O'Brien gave an update on the event Community Members for Environmental Justice (CMEJ) hosted on the importance of zoning. She also shared a letter that CMEJ wrote to CPED and Council asking for a 6-month extension of the public comment period and more intentional engagement. After some discussion, the Northside Green Zone Task Force voted to sign on to CMEJ's letter and send it to City Council.

#### 9. Aldi Leaving North Minneapolis

Michelle Shaw shared about Aldi leaving North Minneapolis. Members discussed what the Northside Green Zone could do about it. One idea is to invite Wellington (the building owner) to a future Northside Green Zone meeting and talk about how they can get another grocery store into that space.

We'll notify you in April if you're selected to order a tree and pick-up will take place in May. All the information to plant and care for your new tree will be provided.

## **Enter the lottery**

**Green Zones residents:** Our main goal is to plant in neighborhoods that have the least number of trees. We want to make sure everyone has equal access to trees, so we are prioritizing the Green Zones and the Northside where the 2011 tornado went through. <u>Green Zones</u> are areas that have historically had high levels of pollution, a high population of people of color, and people with low income.

We provide free trees in these areas. We'll help you select your free tree(s), decide where you want them to go, and even plant them for you. All you need to do is water them every week.
